IN JEWISH WORLD

Two weeks ago one of the most illustrious and prominent of Jewish scholars, Dr. Adolph Neubauer, returned to his native land at Oxford, England. As an expert on Oriental MSS. he became so famous that he was not to work on the night in the Bodleian and Oxford libraries.

The 4th annual report of the Jewish Board of Guardians of London, showing a growing deficit in its funds and that it has dealt with 2,103 new cases, proves that the association has been practically confronted with the Russian immigration. Almost 175,000 had been the expenditure to relieve during the past year. Altogether 4,431 cases were relieved out of the funds.

The anti-Semitic papers in Vienna are furious against Count Goluchowski, the minister for foreign affairs, because he did not send them invitations to a grand ball recently given by him. He had probably stated that a body of men who are hostile to all laws of decency, humanity and civilization, possess no right to special honors.

The suggestion for the holding of a general assembly of Jews in Berlin has taken definite shape. The gathering is to be held in the course of six months and for the purpose will be confined to concerted action of the leading Jewish societies as different from the Zionists, who are to be considered as delegates. It is contemplated to hold simultaneously a counter demonstration in the form of a German Zionist that should their representatives be excluded.

Encouraged no doubt by the immunity from punishment enjoyed by previous adherents of Jewish girls, Frau Anna Leubner, in Leubner, Galicia, recently married a child of eleven named Golda Ryzel, from the home of her parents in order to take her to a convent and there have her baptized as a Christian. But Frau Leubner has not had the good fortune of her predecessor; she was brought to trial for abduction and was found guilty by an established jury. The court pronounced a severe sentence—three years hard labor and deprivation of food on stipulated days. This salutary punishment will, it is hoped, have the effect of putting a stop to the deplorable custom of Jewish girls, of which Michaelina Arsten, who has never been recovered to her parents, was among recent victims.

Reports of the United Hebrew Charities of New York show that during preliminary applications were received numbering 5,774, representing about 12,000 individuals. Of these 4,403 were in the Bureau of Relief. Relief was not given for sufficient reasons in 1,871 cases. Regular monthly allowances were given in 311 cases and included in the number of applications here given. In the Employment Bureau there was a total registry of 383 applicants. Work was found for 316. Shortages for the month were \$1,847.04, and disbursements for relief were \$1,148.22.

THE FUTURE OF WAR.

Mr. H. G. Wells, the author of "The War of the Worlds" etc., is writing in the North American Review a series of forecasts of the future states, which he calls "Anticipation." In the September Review the subject is as to the future of war. Mr. Wells does not grow optimistic nor wild. He merely shows us as it is, not pushing forward into the future. In the light of past development, he imagines what the war of 1910 may be. It is a grotesque picture of huge fortifications, huge forces of the destruction of the individual and the leader, and the appearance of progress and hidden nations. Mr. Wells sketches upon the exact position of the figure why, and his foreboding and arguments regarding the future of the submarine boat are so plausible that they will surely convince here.

"I must confess that my imagination is not of spring, when to see any sort of submarine doing anything but suffocate its crew and founder at sea. It must involve physical inconceivability of the most degrading sort simply to be in for any length of time inside a vessel fit for use, and that vessel a few miles out of port. Imagine that you have hatched and raised, and that some such ship as the Viper is being built and its crewing is about whenever you come up to the surface, and promptly sinking down on your descending bubble with a few minutes (treating a hat of rapping or a net as well. You may, of course, throw out a torpedo or so—with a much chance of hitting a vessel as you would have if you were blindfolded, and would have to fire some time and then the vessel shales at a charging opponent. The possibility of swimming to a submarine with a net would be vividly present in the minds of a submarine crew. If you are near shore you will probably be near rocks—submarine complications in a hurried dive. Probably there would very soon be boats out, the bubble with gunboats or perhaps for a chance at your occasionally emergent conning tower. In no way can a submarine be more than a published; it will be in fact, practically blind. It will shut its eyes to charge; it will always be hitting its eye. Given a device mounted on a slight angle, within sight of land, a carefully shielded submarine might succeed in avoiding the way in and capturing it; but then it would be much better to attack such a vessel and capture it boldly with a few few minutes more on a tag. At the same time the submarine will be used in narrow water, in rivers, or in flatter or deeper ships in harbor.
